The Truth Project is just one element of the Independent Inquiry into Child Sexual Abuse, commissioned by the government. The final report has now been published. The Truth Project involved listening to those who have experienced child sexual abuse. Some of the 6,000 people that shared their personal experience are members of the Visible Reference Group. The Truth Project acknowledged that those who have experience child sexual abuse "could provide a uniquely informed contribution to understanding and learning from past mistakes and improving child protection in the future"
